Dear Friends,

Informed voting and political representation matters. In the past two years, pro-equality advocates and elected officials have achieved important victories in our shared fight for equal rights.

Together, we have achieved great advancements in political representation for the LGBTQ+ community. Congress currently holds a record number of openly LGBTQ+ members from states across the country. The first Senate-confirmed LGBTQ+ cabinet member, Pete Buttigieg, serves as the U.S. Secretary of Transportation. Assistant Secretary for Health, Dr. Rachel Levine, became the first Senate-confirmed openly transgender federal official in the history of our nation. And, in a celebrated confirmation, Ketanji Brown Jackson became the first Black woman to serve on the Supreme Court of the United States. These historic firsts represent important steps toward building a government that is as diverse as the nation it serves.

In addition, we have also seen landmark legislation advance the fight for LGBTQ+ equality. On February 18, 2021, the Equality Act passed in the House, moving us a step closer to achieving greater protections against discrimination for the LGBTQ+ community at a national level. And in July of 2022, the House also passed the Respect for Marriage Act, which would repeal the Defense of Marriage Act and codify federal protections for same-sex marriages.

Congress has acted on key legislation on critical issues that impact our communities, including reproductive justice, combating gun violence, expanding voting rights and advocating for just immigration policy. Together, the House and Senate passed the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, the most significant gun violence prevention act passed in U.S. history.

The 117th Congress has been marked by historic achievements that reflect the commitment of pro-equality advocates in the fight for equal rights. We also recognize that our progress is under renewed attack by extreme forces. Now more than ever, it is essential that voters remain vigilant and informed as they hold elected officials accountable and make decisions about which candidates to support.

In the last two years, anti-equality legislators have shamelessly targeted the basic rights of LGBTQ+ people and other underserved communities. These include attacks on the rights and lives of trans and non-binary youth, attacks on reproductive rights, and attacks on voting rights. Although the majority of these attacks took place in the states, some members of Congress joined in attempts to undermine our foundational rights.

Anti-equality legislators at every level of government are threatening the hard fought progress we have made. We need to fight back, and we need to put our full force into the hard work necessary to ensure full equity for the LGBTQ+ community and other underserved populations.

We hope the 117th Congressional Scorecard will help you to stay informed on your elected officials' records on key issues that impact the LGBTQ+ community. We hope it serves as a valuable tool in holding your elected officials accountable in our shared effort toward achieving equity and equality for all.

U.S. Senate

A Tuberville Amendment to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (S.Amdt. 1386)

Sen. Tommy Tuberville (R-AL) offered an amendment to the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (S.Amdt. 891 to H.R. 1319) to prohibit funds to schools that allow transgender girls and women to participate in athletic programs consistent with their gender identity. The Senate defeated the amendment on March 6, 2021, by a vote of 49-50 (Roll Call Vote No. 97, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 1 yes, 47 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 48 yes, 1 no, 1 not voting; Independents – 0 yes, 2 no, 0 not voting. *HRC opposed the amendment.*

B Cloture on the Motion to Proceed to the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act of 2021 (S. 4)

Sen. Patrick Leahy (D-VT) introduced the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act of 2021 to strengthen voting rights by expanding and strengthening the government's ability to respond to voting discrimination. The Senate rejected cloture on the motion to proceed to the bill on November 3, 2021, by a vote of 50-49 (Roll Call Vote No. 459, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 47 yes, 1 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 1 yes, 48 no, 1 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported cloture on the motion to proceed.*

C Motion to Appeal the Ruling of the Chair to Modify the Filibuster to Pass the Freedom to Vote: John R. Lewis Act (H.R. 5746)

This procedural vote would have modified the filibuster in order to pass the Freedom to Vote: John R. Lewis Act. The Senate was asked to vote on the question, "Shall the Decision of the Chair stand as the Judgment of the Senate?". The Senate rejected the motion on January 19, 2022, by a vote of 52-48 (Roll Call Vote No. 10, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 2 yes, 46 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 50 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Independents – 0 yes, 2 no, 0 not voting. *HRC opposed the decision of the chair.*

D Cloture on the Motion to Proceed to the Women's Health Protection Act of 2022 (S. 4132)

Sen. Richard Blumenthal (D-CT) introduced the Women's Health Protection Act of 2022 to establish a statutory right for health care providers to provide, and their patients to receive, abortion free from medically unnecessary restrictions and limitations, as well as other restrictions, including bans, that single out abortion and impede access to care. The Senate rejected cloture on the motion to proceed to the bill on May 11, 2022, by a vote of 49-51 (Roll Call Vote No. 170, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 47 yes, 1 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 50 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported cloture on the motion to proceed.*

E Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (S.Amdt. 5099)

Sen. Chuck Schumer (D-NY), on behalf of Sen. Chris Murphy (D-CT), offered a substitute amendment to an unrelated bill (S. 2938) to strip out the previous content and replace it with the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, which would respond to the epidemic of gun violence by establishing enhanced background check processes, supporting the implementation of State Red Flag Laws, and narrowing loopholes that have allowed those who abuse spouses and dating partners to buy firearms. It also increases resources and funding available for community violence interventions, mental health services, and school safety. The Senate passed the bill on June 23, 2022, by a vote of 65-33 (Roll Call Vote No. 242, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 48 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 15 yes, 33 no, 2 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

F Pete Buttigieg Confirmation

On February 2, 2021, the Senate voted on President Biden's nomination of Pete Buttigieg to serve as Secretary of Transportation. Sec. Buttigieg is the first openly LGBTQ+, Senate-confirmed person to hold a Cabinet-level position. The Senate confirmed his nomination by a vote of 86-13 (Roll Call Vote No. 11, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 48 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 36 yes, 13 no, 1 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported the nomination.*

G Rachel Levine Confirmation

On March 24, 2021, the Senate voted on President Biden's nomination of Dr. Rachel Levine to serve as Assistant Secretary of Health and Human Services. Dr. Levine is the first openly transgender person confirmed by the Senate. The Senate confirmed her nomination by a vote of 52-48 (Roll Call Vote No. 134, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 48 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 2 yes, 48 no, 0 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported the nomination.*

H Ketanji Brown Jackson Confirmation

On April 7, 2022, the Senate voted on President Biden's nomination of Ketanji Brown Jackson to serve as Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States. The Senate confirmed her nomination by a vote of 53-47 (Roll Call Vote No. 134, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 48 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 3 yes, 47 no, 0 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported the nomination.*

I Beth Robinson Confirmation

On November 1, 2021, the Senate voted on President Biden's nomination of Beth Robinson to be U.S. Circuit Judge for the Second Circuit. The Senate confirmed her nomination by a vote of 51-45 (Roll Call Vote No. 449, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 47 yes, 0 no, 1 not voting; Republicans – 2 yes, 45 no, 3 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported the nomination.*

J Alison Nathan Confirmation

On March 23, 2022, the Senate voted on President Biden's nomination of Alison Nathan to be U.S. Circuit Judge for the Second Circuit. The Senate confirmed her nomination by a vote of 49-47 (Roll Call Vote No. 106, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 45 yes, 0 no, 3 not voting; Republicans – 3 yes, 47 no, 0 not voting; Independents – 1 yes, 0 no, 1 not voting. *HRC supported the nomination.*

K Impeaching Donald John Trump, President of the United States, for High Crimes and Misdemeanors (H.Res. 24)

The House of Representatives passed an article of impeachment of then President Donald Trump, stating that President Trump incited an insurrection against the government of the United States. Former President Trump's efforts to undermine the 2020 election are deeply dangerous and an affront to the fundamental democratic principle of free and fair elections. The Senate found former President Donald Trump not guilty on February 13, 2021, by a vote of 57-43 (Roll Call Vote No. 59, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 48 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 7 yes, 43 no, 0 not voting; Independents – 2 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting. *HRC urged a vote of guilty.*

L Equality Act (S. 393) (Co-Sponsorship)

Senators were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced on February 23, 2021, that would provide consistent and explicit non-discrimination

protections for LGBTQ+ people across key areas of life, including employment, housing, credit, education, public spaces and services, federally funded programs, and jury service. The measure had 49 co-sponsors: Democrats 47; Republicans 0; Independents 2.

M Do No Harm Act (S. 2752) (Co-Sponsorship)

Senators were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced September 15, 2021, that would amend the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) to exempt areas of law where RFRA has been used to bypass federal protections, including civil rights laws, thus restoring the original intent of the legislation and clarifying that RFRA is intended to protect religious freedom without allowing the infliction of harm on other people. The measure had 36 co-sponsors: Democrats 35; Republicans 0; Independents 1.

N Therapeutic Fraud Prevention Act of 2021 (S. 2242) (Co-Sponsorship)

Senators were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced June 24, 2021, that would officially classify the provision and advertising of conversion therapy in exchange for monetary compensation as fraudulent practices and expressly direct the Federal Trade Commission to protect consumers from these harmful and discredited practices. The measure had 43 co-sponsors: Democrats 41; Republicans 0; Independents 2.

O Safe Schools Improvement Act of 2021 (S. 2410) (Co-Sponsorship)

Senators were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced July 21, 2021, that would require school districts in states that receive Elementary and Secondary Education Act funds to adopt codes of conduct specifically prohibiting bullying and harassment, including on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity), disability, and religion. The measure had 38 co-sponsors: Democrats 37; Republicans 0; Independents 1.

P International Human Rights Defense Act of 2021 (S. 424) (Co-Sponsorship)

Senators were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced February 24, 2021, that would build a framework into U.S. diplomacy to protect LGBTQ+ rights worldwide. The bill would make preventing and responding to discrimination and violence against the LGBTQ+ community a foreign policy priority and create a Special Envoy within the State Department who would serve as principal advisor to the Secretary of State on LGBTQ+ issues. The measure had 42 co-sponsors: Democrats 41; Republicans 0; Independents 1.

Q John Lewis Every Child Deserves a Family Act (S. 1848) (Co-Sponsorship)

Senators were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced May 26, 2021, that would prohibit any public child welfare agency receiving federal financial assistance from discriminating against any potential foster or adoptive family on the basis of actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity, marital status, or religion. The measure had 45 co-sponsors: Democrats 43; Republicans 0; Independents 2.

R PrEP Access and Coverage Act (S. 3295) (Co-Sponsorship)

Senators were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced December 1, 2021, that would require all private and public insurance plans to cover prescription drugs that prevent HIV and related services with no out-of-pocket costs for patients. The measure had 31 co-sponsors: Democrats 30; Republicans 0; Independents 1.

U.S. House of Representatives

A Equality Act (H.R. 5)

Rep. David Cicilline (D-RI) introduced the Equality Act to provide consistent and explicit non-discrimination protections for LGBTQ+ people across key areas of life, including employment, housing, credit, education, public spaces and services, federally funded programs, and jury service. The House passed the bill on February 25, 2021, by a vote of 224-206 (Roll Call Vote No. 39, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 221 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 3 yes, 206 no, 2 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

B American Dream and Promise Act of 2021 (H.R. 6)

Rep. Lucille Roybal-Allard (D-CA) introduced the American Dream and Promise Act of 2021 to provide Dreamers the opportunity to apply for permanent legal status and eventually become eligible for U.S. citizenship. The bill also contains protections for recipients of Temporary Protected Status and Deferred Enforced Departure. The House passed the bill on March 18, 2021, by a vote of 228-197 (Roll Call Vote No. 91, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 219 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 9 yes, 197 no, 5 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

C Bipartisan Background Checks Act of 2021 (H.R. 8)

Rep. Mike Thompson (D-CA) introduced the Bipartisan Background Checks Act of 2021 to require background checks for all gun purchases, not just those from licensed dealers. The House passed the bill on March 11, 2021, by a vote of 227-203 (Roll Call Vote No. 75, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 219 yes, 1 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 8 yes, 202 no, 1 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

D John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act of 2021 (H.R. 4)

Rep. Terri Sewell (D-AL) introduced the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act of 2021 to strengthen voting rights by expanding and strengthening the government's ability to respond to voting discrimination. The House passed the bill on August 24, 2021, by a vote of 219-212 (Roll Call Vote No. 260, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 219 yes, 0 no, 1 not voting; Republicans – 0 yes, 212 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

E Violence Against Women Act Reauthorization Act of 2021 (H.R. 1620)

Rep. Sheila Jackson Lee (D-TX) introduced the Violence Against Women Act Reauthorization Act of 2021 to reauthorize critical domestic violence programs. It also included a grant program targeting the LGBTQ+ community. The House passed the bill on March 17, 2021, by a vote of 244-172 (Roll Call Vote No. 86, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 215 yes, 0 no, 4 not voting; Republicans – 29 yes, 172 no, 10 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

F**LGBTQ Business Equal Credit Enforcement and Investment Act (H.R. 1443)**

Rep. Ritchie Torres (D-NY) introduced the LGBTQ Business Equal Credit Enforcement and Investment Act to require financial institutions to report data regarding LGBTQ-owned businesses to the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau for the purposes of enforcing fair lending laws. The House passed the bill on June 24, 2021, by a vote of 252-176 (Roll Call Vote No. 182, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 219 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 33 yes, 176 no, 2 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

G**Anti-LGBTQ+ Amendments to FY 2022 Appropriations Bill (H.Amdt. 83 to H.R. 4502)**

Reps. Debbie Lesko (R-AZ), Virginia Foxx (R-NC), and Russ Fulcher (R-ID) offered two anti-LGBTQ+ amendments (Lesko #46 and Foxx/Fulcher #89) to an FY 2022 appropriations package that were voted on in an en bloc amendment (H.Amdt. 83). The Lesko Amendment would have removed a provision in the underlying bill prohibiting funding to any child welfare organization that does not comply with regulations prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age, disability, sex, race, color, national origin, religion, gender identity, or sexual orientation. The Foxx/Fulcher Amendment would have prohibited funds from being used to rescind the Trump administration's discriminatory rule undermining non-discrimination protections for federal contractors. The House defeated the amendment on July 27, 2021, by a vote of 192-232 (Roll Call Vote No. 228, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 0 yes, 218 no, 1 not voting; Republicans – 192 yes, 14 no, 5 not voting. *HRC opposed the amendment.*

H**Women's Health Protection Act of 2021 (H.R. 3755)**

Rep. Judy Chu (D-CA) introduced the Women's Health Protection Act of 2021 to establish a statutory right for health care providers to provide, and their patients to receive, abortion free from medically unnecessary restrictions and limitations, as well as other restrictions, including bans, that single out abortion and impede access to care. The House passed the bill on September 24, 2021, by a vote of 218-211 (Roll Call Vote No. 295, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 218 yes, 1 no, 1 not voting; Republicans – 0 yes, 210 no, 2 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

I**Family Violence Prevention and Services Improvement Act of 2021 (H.R. 2119)**

Rep. Lucy McBath (D-GA) introduced the Family Violence Prevention and Services Improvement Act of 2021 to update the Family Violence and Prevention Services program which funds emergency shelters and supports related assistance for victims of domestic violence. It also includes an important LGBTQ-inclusive non-discrimination provision as well as providing grants that are culturally appropriate to underserved groups. The House passed the bill on October 26, 2021, by a vote of 228-200 (Roll Call Vote No. 336, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 219 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 9 yes, 200 no, 3 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

J**Global Respect Act (H.R. 3485)**

Rep. David Cicilline (D-RI) introduced the Global Respect Act to provide a means to prevent individuals who violate the human rights of LGBTQ+ people from entry into the United States. The House passed the bill on February 9, 2022, by a vote of 227-206 (Roll Call Vote No. 43, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 221 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 6 yes, 206 no, 0 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

K **LGBTQI+ Data Inclusion Act (H.R. 4176)**

Rep. Raúl Grijalva (D-AZ) introduced the LGBTQI+ Data Inclusion Act to facilitate the self-disclosed collection of data on sexual orientation, gender identity, and variations in sex characteristics across federal surveys. The House passed the bill on June 23, 2022, by a vote of 220-201 (Roll Call Vote No. 296, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 218 yes, 0 no, 1 not voting; Republicans – 2 yes, 201 no, 7 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

L **Bipartisan Safer Communities Act (S. 2938)**

Sen. Chuck Schumer (D-NY), on behalf of Sen. Chris Murphy (D-CT), offered a substitute amendment (S.Amdt. 5099) to an unrelated bill (S. 2938) to strip out the previous content and replace it with the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act, which would respond to the epidemic of gun violence by establishing enhanced background check processes, supporting the implementation of State Red Flag Laws, and narrowing loopholes that have allowed those who abuse spouses and dating partners to buy firearms. It also increases resources and funding available for community violence interventions, mental health services, and school safety. The House passed the bill as amended on June 24, 2022, by a vote of 234-193 (Roll Call Vote No. 299, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 220 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 14 yes, 193 no, 3 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

M **Respect for Marriage Act (H.R. 8404)**

Rep. Jerrold Nadler (D-NY) introduced the Respect for Marriage Act to repeal the discriminatory Defense of Marriage Act, guaranteeing the rights, benefits, and obligations of marriage in the federal code, and affirming that public acts, records, and proceedings should be recognized by all states. The House passed the bill on July 19, 2022, by a vote of 267-157 (Roll Call Vote No. 373, 2nd Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 220 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 47 yes, 157 no, 7 not voting. *HRC supported the bill.*

N **Impeaching Donald John Trump, President of the United States, for High Crimes and Misdemeanors (H.Res. 24)**

Rep. David Cicilline (D-RI) introduced an article of impeachment stating that then President Donald Trump incited an insurrection against the government of the United States. Former President Trump's efforts to undermine the 2020 election are deeply dangerous and an affront to the fundamental democratic principle of free and fair elections. The House impeached then President Donald Trump on January 13, 2021, by a vote of 232-197 (Roll Call Vote No. 17, 1st Session, 117th Congress). Democrats – 222 yes, 0 no, 0 not voting; Republicans – 10 yes, 197 no, 4 not voting. *HRC supported impeachment.*

O **Do No Harm Act (H.R. 1378) (Co-Sponsorship)**

Representatives were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced on February 25, 2021, that would amend the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) to exempt areas of law where RFRA has been used to bypass federal protections, including civil rights laws, thus restoring the original intent of the legislation and clarifying that RFRA is intended to protect religious freedom without allowing the infliction of harm on other people. The measure had 202 co-sponsors: Democrats 202; Republicans 0.

P**Therapeutic Fraud Prevention Act of 2021 (H.R. 4146) (Co-Sponsorship)**

Representatives were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced on June 24, 2021, that would officially classify the provision and advertising of conversion therapy in exchange for monetary compensation as fraudulent practices and expressly direct the Federal Trade Commission to protect consumers from these harmful and discredited practices. The measure had 193 co-sponsors: Democrats 193; Republicans 0.

Q**Safe Schools Improvement Act of 2021 (H.R. 4402) (Co-Sponsorship)**

Representatives were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced on July 9, 2021, that would require school districts in states that receive Elementary and Secondary Education Act funds to adopt codes of conduct specifically prohibiting bullying and harassment, including on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex (including sexual orientation and gender identity), disability, and religion. The measure had 212 co-sponsors: Democrats 209; Republicans 3.

R**John Lewis Every Child Deserves a Family Act (H.R. 3488) (Co-Sponsorship)**

Representatives were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced on May 25, 2021, that would prohibit any public child welfare agency receiving federal financial assistance from discriminating against any potential foster or adoptive family on the basis of actual or perceived sexual orientation, gender identity, marital status, or religion. The measure had 224 co-sponsors: Democrats 223; Republicans 1.

S**PrEP Access and Coverage Act (H.R. 6117) (Co-Sponsorship)**

Representatives were asked to co-sponsor legislation introduced on December 1, 2021, that would require all private and public insurance plans to cover prescription drugs that prevent HIV and related services with no out-of-pocket costs for patients. The measure had 186 co-sponsors: Democrats 186; Republicans 0.

T**Discharge Petition on Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act of 2021 (Discharge Petition No. 13)**

Rep. Jim Banks (R-IN) introduced a discharge petition on April 26, 2022, to require a vote on H.R. 426, the Protection of Women and Girls in Sports Act of 2021, which would prohibit transgender girls and women from participating in school athletics consistent with their gender identity. The discharge petition did not receive the 218 signatures needed to force a vote on H.R. 426. The petition had 187 signatures: Democrats 0; Republicans 187. *HRC opposed the discharge petition.*
