After a Decade of Research, the Workplace Closet Has Shrunk...



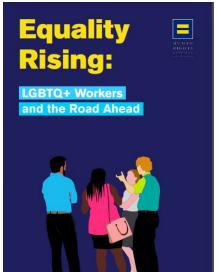




2008 51% Closeted

2023 16% Closeted

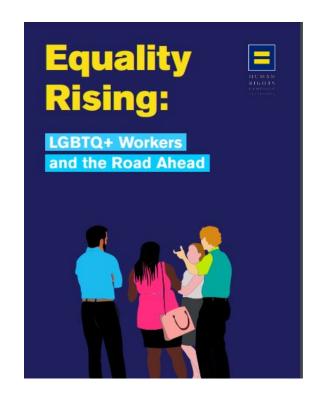

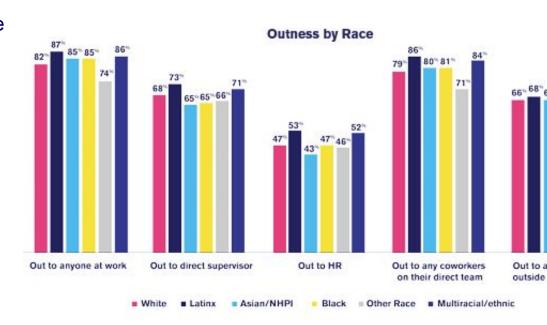

Outness @ Work Considerations

Privacy

- Half (51%) of LGBTQ+ workers have previously been in the closet
- 37% of trans and non-binary workers do to fear they of being asked personal questions about their transition status, physical appearance or body
- Loss of Status at the Workplace
 - 3 in 10 have been previously because of
 - 18% lose of connections and relationships
 - Thought coworkers would think they're not professional
 - 9% sexual orientation
 - 19% gender identity

Outness @ Work Considerations

- Discrimination and Lack of Protections
 - Nearly ¼ closeted for fears of discrimination or no policies to protect them
 - A lack of policies protecting LGBTQ+ people at their job (11%)
 - Fears they would not be considered for advancement or development opportunities (16%)
 - Fear of being fired (8% of all LGBTQ+ workers, 14% of transgender and non-binary workers)

Outness @ Work Considerations

- Violence, Stigma and Victimization
 - 40% of LGBTQ+ workers were previously closeted because of ACTUAL and perceived risk of violence, stigma and/or victimization
 - Fears they could make people feel uncomfortable if they were out (25%)
 - Fears that people would assume they were attracted to them because they are an LGBTQ+ person (19%)
 - Fears for their personal safety (13%)
 - 8% because they or someone they know at work has been humiliated on the job for being an LGBTQ+ person

The 13% of LGBTQ+ workers of color who say they have been told to dress more masculine or feminine than they were presenting includes:

- 11.7% Latinx LGBTQ+ workers
- 7.5% Asian (American), Native Hawaiian, and Other Pacific Islander (AANHPI) LGBTQ+ workers
- 10.7% Black LGBTQ+ workers
- 21.5% Multiracial/ethnic LGBTQ+ workers
- $\bullet \ \, \textbf{5.7\% of Other race/ethnicity LGBTQ+ workers (} \ \, \textbf{\tiny including American}$

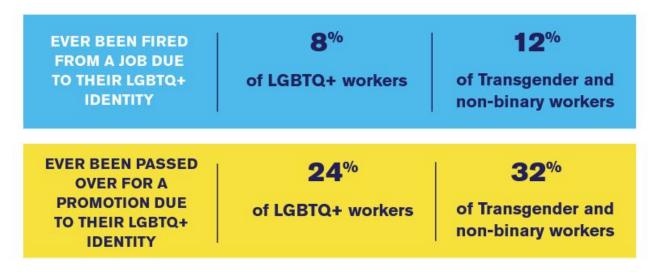

Impact of Unaffirming Workplace Climates on Workers

Workplace discrimination unfortunately remains all too common.



Unaffirming work environments and all the side-effects they bring can have a substantial impact on retention, attrition, and workplace productivity — for LGBTQ+ and non-LGBTQ+ workers alike.

The cost of the closet: retention & turnover

As result of working in an unwelcoming environment

Searched for a different job

26% LGBTQ+ workers

36% transgender and non-binary workers

Left a job

28% LGBTQ+ workers

37% transgender and non-binary workers
