Polling was conducted online from September 7-12, 2023. Using Dynamic Online Sampling to attain a representative sample, Change Research polled 531 likely 2024 Democratic primary voters in Delaware's At-Large Congressional District. Post-stratification was performed on age, gender, race/ethnicity, and county.
