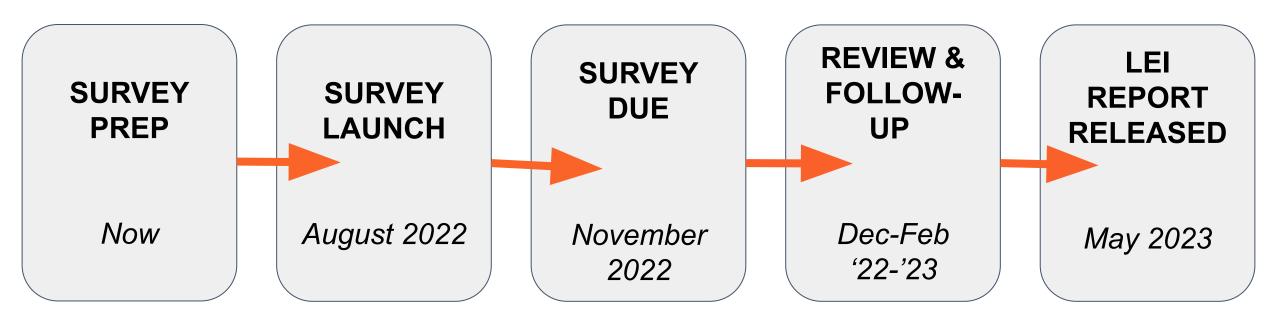

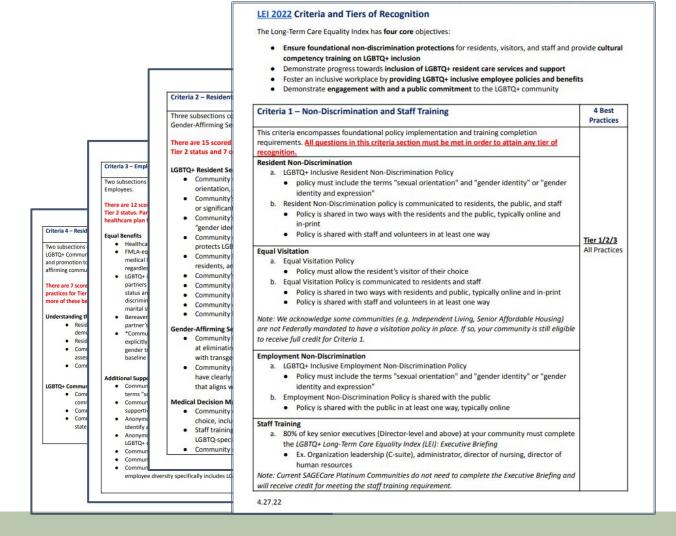

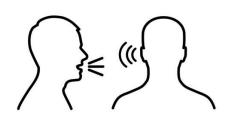

Protocol and guidance for staff

- When it is relevant and how to ask questions, etc.

i. Example: Interactions with Trans Residents

A. Procedure/Responsibility:

Protocol for interaction with transgender patients:

- 1. A transgender patient's preferred pronoun should be determined as follows:
 - a. If the resident's gender presentation clearly indicates to a reasonable person the gender with which the resident wishes to be identified, the Woodland Pond staff member should refer to the resident using pronouns appropriate to that gender.
 - b. If the Woodland Pond staff member determines the resident preferred pronoun on the basis of the resident's gender presentation, but is then corrected by the resident, the staff member should then use the pronouns associated with the gender identity verbally expressed by the resident.
 - c. If the resident's gender presentation does not clearly indicates the residents gender identity, the Woodland Pond staff member should discreetly and politely ask the resident for the residents preferred pronoun and name.
- 2. Staff may only ask residents about their transgender status, sex assigned at birth or transition-related procedures when such information is directly relevant to the residents care.

ii. Example: Access to Restrooms

C. Access to Restrooms:

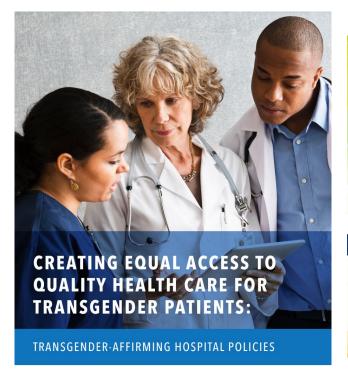
All residents at *ABC Community* may use the restroom that matches their gender identity, regardless of whether they are making a gender transition or apear to be gender-nonconforming.

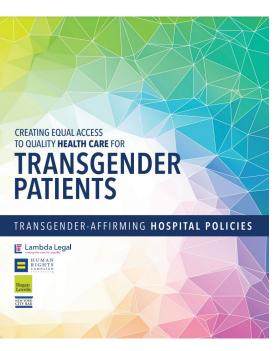
ii. Example: Continuation of Treatment

Access to Hormone Therapy:

The purpose is to ensure that hormone therapy will be provided for transgender residents in a manner consistent with the prevailing standard of care. Transgender patients that have been receiving hormone therapy prior to admission should have that therapy continued without interruption pending evaluation by a specialist absent urgent medical reasons to the contrary. Health care providers unfamiliar with this aspect of care will consult with providers who have this expertise as well with the patient's prescribing physician if possible.

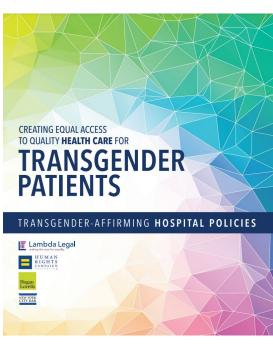

b. Gender-Neutral Restrooms

Under New York City Law, all persons have the right to use the restroom that matches their gender identity or expression.

Advanced Directives.

Your Right to Decide



Healthcare representative.

A "healthcare representative" is a person you choose to receive healthcare information and make healthcare decisions for you when you cannot. You can choose to appoint any adult over the age of 18, including but not limited to a spouse, unmarried partner of the same or opposite sex, parent, sibling, child or friend. To choose a healthcare representative, you must fill out an appointment of healthcare representative document that names the person you choose to act for you. Your healthcare representative may agree to or refuse medical care and treatments when you are unable to do so. Your representative will make these choices based on your advance directive. If you want, in certain cases and in consultation with your physician, your healthcare representative may decide if food, water, or respiration should be given artificially as part of your medical treatment. Choosing a healthcare representative is part of the Indiana Health Care Consent Act, found at Indiana Code § 16-36-1. The advance directive naming a healthcare representative must be in writing, signed by you, and witnessed by another adult. Because these are serious decisions, your healthcare representative must make them in your best interest. Indiana courts have made it clear that decisions made for you by your healthcare representative should be honored.

Medical Decision-Making

- Patients have the right to designate a person of their choice as their health care agent
- For example, take Lisa and Janet, an unmarried same-sex couple
 - They may designate each other as health care agent through advance care directives

 - "It is important to note that healthcare agents are decided by the patient, just as they are able to define their own family at VUMC. Anyone, including an unmarried same-sex partner, can be the health care agent"

Introduction



What is an "Advance Directive"?

- A written statement of wishes, preferences and choices regarding end-of-life health care decisions (also called a Living Will)
- · A tool to help think through and communicate choices
- Includes the appointment of a "Healthcare Proxy", "Healthcare Representative" and/or "Power of Attorney" to carry out wishes; if you are unable to speak for yourself
 - This person must be at least 18 years of age and may be a friend, family member (including same sex partners), or any other party the patient elects to carry out their healthcare wishes.

Did you know...

"Only about a quarter (26%) of Americans currently have an advance directive — like a living will, according to a 2014 study by the American Journal of Preventive Medicine. Lack of awareness was the top reason for why the majority do not."
