Find Your Community of LGBTQ+ & Allied Peers

Build up your chosen family with friends your age that support your identity and affirm who you are. This can include joining your school's GSA, finding a local LGBTQ+ youth group, and/or finding affirming spaces online.

Identify Trusted Adults in Your School & Community

Find teachers and school staff who affirm your identity and make you feel safe. Identify adults in your family, your faith community, and in your neighborhood who affirm who you are and make you feel loved and supported. Look for LGBTQ+ affirming symbols in classrooms, libraries, and community centers to find places that support our community.
