Create displays that show a wide range of occupations and achievements for all people.	Ensure that families and caregivers are aware of their student's rights and know who to contact at the school for support.
■ Engage students in social emotional learning; developing strategies for communicating with peers, deepening empathy, compassion and allyship.	Develop bullying report forms that are accessible to families (on school website, available in multiple languages).
